Plan ahead to avoid long delays

Throughout March and April, works will occur on the Mernda line to remove the dangerous and congested level crossing at High Street, prepare for the new Reservoir Station and carry out maintenance along the line. These works will involve disruption to your journey so we'd like to help you plan ahead to avoid long delays.

At the same time, buses are replacing trains on a number of metropolitan and regional lines to remove level crossings, build the Metro Tunnel and upgrade train lines. We expect that other public transport services and roads will be busier than usual.

AFL fans should allow extra time to get to the MCG in April, with a number of train lines not running to Richmond Station. The free tram zone will be extended to the MCG for affected games.

Please also plan ahead and allow more time if you're attending a show at the Melbourne International Comedy Festival.

Thanks for your patience while we improve the transport network.

Trains may operate to an altered timetable on sections of the Mernda line during planned disruptions.



Reservoir Station changes

During March and April, changes will take place at Reservoir Station to prepare for construction of the new station. You will notice the following changes:

- The station buildings will be removed and fencing will be installed around work areas
- The customer service office and toilets will be relocated to the station car park, off High Street
- Temporary station facilities, such as myki machines, will be installed.

These changes mean Reservoir Station can remain open for passengers while the new station is being built, except during planned disruptions.
